Also I would like to thank our school neighbours, who may have been inconvenienced by the construction, for their understanding.

I didn't realise that because of COVID-19 builders can now work to 8:00pm and also work on Sundays until 2:00pm.

**Congratulations to all participants in the School Cross Country Championships held on Thursday of this week.** A big thank you to Ms Papic for organising the event.

The top six competitors in each division will now compete at the Zone Cross Country Championships to be held on Tuesday 4 May at the St Ives Showground.

It was also lovely that parents were able to attend the event.

We do apologise for the length of time that it took for parents to sign in as part of the COVID-19 requirements. We didn't anticipate the number of parents in attendance which was considerably more than usual. Normally we might have thirty parents in attendance at a



school cross country event. On Thursday we had over one hundred very supportive parents onsite.

#### Congratulations to the captains and prefects for organising a lovely ANZAC Day commemorative service on Monday of this week.

Children had the opportunity to acknowledge and commemorate those brave servicemen and servicewomen who served our country in times of war and peace and in some circumstances made the ultimate sacrifice of giving their lives for their country. Concert Band 1 in their first performance for 2021 played the Black Forest Overture beautifully.

# The Gordon West Public School uniform policy was determined and endorsed by the Gordon West school community under the Fair Discipline Code.

The school community after careful consideration chose the winter and summer uniform and the expectation is that all Gordon West children will adhere to the policy. Of course we are a Public School and children can't be forced to wear a uniform. However the vast majority of our students wear the uniform with pride.

Full winter uniform is expected to be worn from next Monday 3 May 2021.

Sports jackets are not part of the winter uniform and can only be worn over the winter jumper for extra warmth not as a substitute.

Major changes have been made to the girl's winter uniform with girls being given the option of wearing slacks/ pants instead of wearing the traditional tunic. Unfortunately due in part to COVID-19 the winter slacks haven't arrived as yet.



The sharing of food has always been a contentious issue at the school and COVID-19 has further highlighted this very controversial subject.

Initially our concerns related to hygiene and anaphylactic reactions.

Transmission of COVID-19 is now a major issue associated with the sharing of food.

Erring on the side of caution our policy has been not to share food and with the arrival of COVID-19 we have further strengthened our policy and determination. Children can still celebrate birthdays at the school. Wrapping food or treats individually is one method of overcoming the challenges in the celebration of a birthday.

Also the school canteen has introduced an ice block program where to celebrate a birthday a parent can order ice blocks from the canteen.

#### NAPLAN Online 2021

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Our school will be participating in NAPLAN Online between 11 and 21 May 2021.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN Online is not recommended. Students can use the <u>public</u> <u>demonstration site</u> (<u>https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</u>) to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN Online tests.

# Walking or riding to and from school with your child helps:

- Reduce traffic and improve road safety.
- Reduce our carbon footprint.
- Promote physical activity.
- Provide an opportunity for supervising adults to talk with their child about road safety.

#### **Holding Hands**

Until your child is at least **8 years old**, hold their hand:

- On the footpath.
- In the car park.
- When crossing the road.

Up until at least **10 years old**, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road.

# Key messages for kids to stay safe when walking and riding:

- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross a road or driveway.
- Stay alert, look up don't get distracted by your phone.
- Use pedestrian crossings where possible.
- Always wear a helmet when riding a bike, scooter or skateboard.
- Take extra care around trucks and buses they can't always see you.

If you are driving, always look out for people walking or riding. And remember: slow down to 40 when bus lights flash.
