## Principal's Report

However we live in the present moment and need to get on with life the best we can, remaining positive and making sure that we support each other through the many challenges being presented.

Although self praise is no recommendation we are very pleased with how our Learning From Home Program has been implemented and developed. However we do welcome constructive feedback from the school community.

We were very lucky that the overall planning of our Learning From Home Program was organised prior to the implementation of more stringent rules in relation to staff numbers in attendance at school. Staff worked incredibly well together during the first week of term to get these programs planned and implemented in a very short period of time.

Once again we thank you for your incredible support with the vast majority of parents working with us to provide excellent educational programs.

It is a very stressful time for some members of society and sometimes we need to implement strategies to lessen the affect of our anxiety. One method that I have found very helpful is to write a letter of response to a stressful situation and then place it in my top drawer for at least two days.

Thankfully I cannot recall ever sending such a letter.

Student participation in Learning From Home Programs is closely monitored with the parents of non participants contacted immediately. Current rates of participation are running at approximately 97 % which is wonderful.

All class teachers, Mr Sparke and Mrs Hayward (our Learning Support and Student Wellbeing Supervisor) are very closely monitoring the wellbeing of all Gordon West students.

What is more wonderful is that our students appear to be really enjoying the Zoom sessions interacting beautifully with their classmates.

However once again we must not become complacent in relation to COVID-19 the results of which could be catastrophic.

We thank you for following the COVID-19 guidelines of signing in using the QR codes and wearing masks if and when you have been granted permission to enter the school site.

Once again during the vacation Salvatore Castelnuovo (Sam) was extremely busy organising contractors to complete a number of important projects on the school site.





The "Diggers Area" has now been completed and our younger students have a designated area in which to dig to their hearts content without damaging our gardens. Unfortunately during the holidays some unwelcome visitors to the school did some damage to our beautiful new sandstone boulders. All of our school gardens were cleaned and mulched with the school looking a picture.

We are racing to have all of the planned work completed by Wednesday's deadline with particular emphasis on the Year 6 MDR ramp repairs.


